Foundation Celebrates Students and Teachers at Evening of Excellence

The Foundation recognized 36 graduating seniors and the 24 teachers those students nominated as Educators of Excellence at the annual Evening of Excellence on May 3rd. Graduating seniors with a grade point average of 3.75 or higher were named the 2018 Scholars of Excellence. These students were all asked to nominate a teacher who made a difference in their education to be considered for the BankWest Educator of Excellence Award and \$1,500 grant.

"The Educator of Excellence nominees came from the grade school, middle school and high school levels this year," according to Jennifer Stalley, Foundation Executive Secretary. "The nominations included incredible stories of how these 24 educators made a difference in the lives of these students, starting as early as elementary school in some cases. These educators played a huge role in the academic success of these students and it was exciting for the Foundation to play a role in sharing that impact through the Evening of Excellence," said Stalley.

The 2018 BankWest Educator of Excellence, selected from the 24 nominees, was announced at the Evening of Excellence. John Kalda, T.F. Riggs science teacher, was selected as this year's winner. One of the nominations for Mr. Kalda noted, "Mr. Kalda has left the biggest impact on me. He is one of those teachers that you just don't forget. The first day I had class with him I was nervous because I had decided to double up on my sciences. But after spending just one day in his class I knew I was going to be okay. Mr. Kalda teaches quickly yet effectively, gladly answers your questions, and empowers you to be successful."



Schliessmann Family Scholarship

The Schliessmann Scholarship was recently established by Donald and Judith Schliessmann to support a T.F. Riggs High School graduating senior planning to enroll in an accredited college or university to pursue a career in a science, technology, engineering or mathematics. This scholarship is in the amount of \$1,000 for up to 4 years.

Erick Colman is the inaugural recipient of the Schliessmann Family scholarship. Colman plans to pursue a mechanical engineering degree. He excelled at hands on training in the T.F. Riggs vocational classes, as well as advanced placement classes in mathematics and science. He has worked part-time during his high school career. He will also participate on the Hardrockers track and field team during his college career.

Charles "Lindy" & Shirley Feeney Scholarship

Erick Colman received the 2018 Charles "Lindy" and Shirley Feeney Scholarship. This scholarship is offered to a T.F. Riggs High School graduating senior who is in need of financial assistance to further their education beyond high school.

The purpose of this scholarship is to assist a dedicated track athlete in his/her higher education costs. This student must have participated in track & field for at least three years, and must be accepted to an accredited college, university or technical school. This scholarship is \$1,000.

Colman will attend South Dakota School of Mine and Technology this fall and hopes to one day own his own business to design and manufacture useful things.

Mini-Grants Awarded to Support Classrooms

The Foundation awarded three grants to classroom teachers to support innovation during the Spring Mini-Grant Program. The objective of this grant program is to support efforts by teachers to bring new and innovative programs and activities to the classroom. The Spring grantees are:

Amber Stout **Jefferson Elementary School** **I Survived Book Series**

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This grant allows the elementary teacher to introduce students to a world of historical figures, historic places, and different eras through series of books that encourage reading. The series of books will not only promote reading but also provide lessons in overcoming problems, obstacles and criticism to succeed.

Jennifer Nedrebo **Buchanan Elementary School** **Jackie Richie** **Jefferson Elementary School** **Break Outside the Box**

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This grant will support the materials necessary for projects that promote critical thinking and teamwork in an Escape Room type activity. The project emphasizes reading, writing, math, science and social studies skills to allow the students to find a way out of the box.

Tom Rogers **T.F. Riggs High School** **Logic Trace Digitizing System**

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This grant supports the purchase of a Logic Trace Digitizing System that will allow students to trace any outline, template, object or part to be used in making plasma cuts, use with laser cutters and develop 3D printer outputs. The technology of this project will keep T.F. Riggs classrooms in the cutting edge of technology.

Mini-Grants in Action

Students in Mrs. Todd's Family and Consumer Sciences class at Georgia Morse Middle School had the opportunity to learn cooking skills with kitchen equipment funded by a PEF Mini-Grant earlier this year. These students participated in an 8-week program to teach the importance of food safety, preparation and nutrition.
