Foundation to Raffle Donated Chest

As the Class of 1971 prepares to celebrate its 50th reunion, you have a special opportunity to help support the Pierre Educational Foundation and win a one of a kind, handcrafted, blanket chest – a winning combination all around!

As part of the Class of 1971's 50th reunion, the Pierre Educational Foundation is raffling a Greene and Greene design inspired blanket chest, handcrafted and donated by Jim Thompson (TF Riggs Class of '71). The blanket chest is constructed of Cuban Mahogany, an extremely rare and expensive wood. The wood for this chest was acquired over 20 years ago when a tropical storm downed trees, allowing for the legal harvesting of the rare wood. Thompson spent over 150 hours handcrafting this beautiful chest, valued at \$4,000.



"This is a one of a kind piece," according to Jennifer Stalley, Foundation Executive Director. "I had a chance to speak with Mr. Thompson about the process he used for building this beautiful piece – from the single slabs of Cuban mahogany used to make the sides and top of the chest, to the heavy duty torsion hinges that open and close it, to the pedestal feet on the underside made by none other than Rich Nye, former Chicago Cubs Rookie of the Year – and this is a piece that is not only magnificent when you see it, but with a rich story of how it came to be." Stalley said, "The Foundation is so lucky to have this donation and it is exciting to offer a chance to win it to our alumni and supporters. Someone is going to be very happy when the raffle drawing takes place."

Pierre Educational Foundation Awards Scholarships

The Foundation awarded over \$22,000 in scholarships to 10 students selected to receive scholarships endowed with the Foundation. These scholarships are donor directed and provide scholarships for students pursuing specific career goals or who accomplished specific achievements during their high school career. This year, the Foundation awarded the newly created Shaw Family Scholarship in memory of Mike and Marilyn Shaw, longtime Pierre residents who were impactful servant leadership their community to three students. The Foundation also awarded the first Warder Family Scholarship, established in memory of Edith and Richard Warder, for a student planning to pursue a career in law. The Foundation is proud of all the 2021 scholarship winners.



Charles “Lindy” and Shirley Feeney Scholarship

The Charles “Lindy” and Shirley Feeney Scholarship is awarded to a dedicated track athlete to assist with the costs of higher education. The recipient of the scholarship must have participated in track for at least three years, show determination, hard work and perseverance in the

sport and be accepted to a college or technical school. **Kenzie Gronlund** was awarded this year’s \$1,000 Charles “Lindy” and Shirley Feeney Scholarship. Gronlund is a member of the softball, volleyball, basketball and track teams. In addition, she has diverse and numerous volunteer experiences in the community including helping elementary children as a tutor, volunteer at youth sports camps and helping Feeding South Dakota and PARS to provide food for needy families. Gronlund plans to attend South Dakota State University to pursue a career in mathematics with a specialization in education and minoring in coaching.



Herbert and Irene Emde Family Scholarship

The Emde Family Scholarship is awarded to a T.F. Riggs High School graduating senior who is pursuing a degree in education. The intent of the \$1,000 scholarship is to support a student’s efforts to become a teacher in an elementary, middle school, high school or university

setting. **Seneca Hertel** was awarded the 2021 Emde Scholarship. Hertel plans to attend the University of Nebraska Kearny to major in communication disorders and minor in special education with plans to pursue a master’s in speech-language pathology. In addition to her academic achievements, Hertel is the secretary for national honor society, member of Governor to Governor, volunteer swim coach and youth leader at her church.



The Pierre Hospital Auxiliary Scholarship

The Pierre Hospital Auxiliary Scholarship Fund was established in 2019 by the Pierre Hospital Auxiliary. This \$1,000 scholarship is intended to go to a graduating high school student who will enter the medical field. The scholarship may be awarded to a student attending

a college, university, technical or vocational school. The 2021

Pierre Hospital Auxiliary scholarship was awarded to **Emma Lusk**. Lusk plans to attend South Dakota State University to major in human biology and biomedical engineering. Upon completion of her undergraduate degree, Lusk plans to attend medical school. In addition to her school involvement, including Student Body President, Future Business Leaders of America, student council and varsity track, Lusk also volunteered in the community including as a Avera Helmsley Center greeter, teacher’s aide and Capital Area United Way board member.

James and Gertrude Mueller Scholarship Fund

The James and Gertrude Mueller Scholarship was established in 1997 by Mrs. Gertrude Mueller to recognize a T.F. Riggs senior who intends to enter the medical field. The scholarship committee considers the scholastic achievement, work experience, community contributions, financial need, and college plans and goals related to pursuing a medical career in selecting the recipient. The scholarship award is \$3,500. **Emma Lusk** is the 2021 recipient of the James and Gertrude Mueller Scholarship. Lusk plans to attend South Dakota State University to major in human biology, and biomedical engineering. Upon completion of her undergraduate degree, Lusk plans to attend medical school. In addition to her school involvement, including Student Body President, Future Business Leaders of America, student council and varsity track, Lusk also volunteered in the community including Avera Helmsley Center greeter, teacher’s aide and Capital Area United Way board member.



Schliessmann Family Scholarship

The Schliessmann Scholarship is awarded to a T.F. Riggs High School senior who will be pursuing a degree in science, technology, engineering or mathematics (STEM) from an accredited college or university. The intent of this scholarship is to support a student’s efforts to pursue a career in a STEM field. The \$1,000

scholarship is renewable for three additional years for a total scholarship award of \$4,000. The 2021 Schliessmann Scholarship was awarded to **Hannah Schochenmaier**. Schochenmaier plans to attend South Dakota State University and major in animal science along with completing her undergrad in pre-vet medicine. She is a member of the national honor society, leader for the cheer team and is a member of the FFA chapter where she serves as president.

Spilde Family Scholarship

The Spilde Family Scholarship was established to assist a student with the costs of his/her higher education cost. There is one \$2,500 scholarship for a student attending a college/university and one \$2,500 scholarship for a student attending a vocational or technical school.

The 2021 Spilde Family Scholarship university recipient is **Taylee Agard** (pictured below). Agard plans to pursue a career in health sciences and kinesiology at the University of South Dakota. Her goals include working towards a doctorate's degree to pursue a career in the medical field, working with children and their health. The 2021 Spilde Family Scholarship technical school recipient is **Khia White Eyes** (pictured above). White Eyes plans to attend Lake Area Technical College to become an occupational therapy assistant. She was active in competitive cheer for three years and captain her senior year. She is a mentor for the Governor to Governor Program.

Mortenson Family Scholarship

The Mortenson Family Scholarship is awarded to a T.F. Riggs Native American senior who demonstrates academic achievement, a financial need, and a desire to pursue a post-secondary education at a college or technical school. The scholarship awards up to \$1,600 to the recipient.



Taylee Agard is the 2021 Mortenson Family Scholarship recipient. Agard plans to pursue a career in health sciences and kinesiology at the University of South Dakota. Her goals include

working towards a doctorate's degree to pursue a career in the medical field, working with children and their health.

Warder Family Scholarship

The Edith and Richard Warder Scholarship was established in 2020 by Robert and Jo Anna Warder. The \$1,000 scholarship is intended to go to a graduating high school student who has an interest in political science or law. The inaugural 2021 Edith and Richard Warder Scholarship was awarded to **Nolan**



Rounds.

Rounds plans to attend South Dakota State University. He is student body vice president, member of Governor-to-Governor mentorship program and national honor society president. He was a South Dakota Legislative page during the 2020 and 2021 legislative sessions. After obtaining his bachelor's degree, he hopes to attend graduate school.

Shaw Family Scholarship

The Shaw Family Scholarship Fund was established in 2020 by the Shaw Family in memory of Mike and Marilyn Shaw, longtime Pierre residents who were impactful servant leaders in their community. The inaugural 2021 Shaw Family Scholarship, in the amount of \$1,500 was awarded to **Delaney Engbrecht, Levi McKinley and Paige Pollreis.**



Engbrecht plans to attend Southeast Technical College and obtain her invasive cardiovascular technologist degree. Engbrecht is Drumline Captain, student leader for Governor to Governor Program and President of Tri-M Music Honor Society. She is a youth leader at her church and has participated on two-week mission trips to Juarez Mexico for the past four summers.



McKinley plans to attend the South Dakota State University with plans to become a veterinarian. McKinley is active in cross-country, chamber and all-state choir; Governor to Governor team leader and secretary for the Tri-M Music Honors Society. He is an assistant teacher for children's ministry at his church and volunteer for Victory Center Bible Camp.
